

Sin Condemned

- I. Condemnation – (1)
 - A. The result of being saved – No condemnation
 - 1. Covered in His righteousness
 - 2. Our sin at salvation is completely forgiven
 - B. We have a new walk – A changed life! (1 Cor. 5:17)
 - 1. We no longer walk after the flesh
 - 2. We now walk after the Spirit
- II. Justification - (2)
 - C. Before salvation we were in bondage to the law of sin and death
 - 1. Law of sin - Romans 7:19-21
 - 2. Law of death
 - a. Hebrews 9:27
 - b. John 3:16
 - D. The result of our salvation
 - 1. The Law of the Spirit is in control
 - 2. The Law of the Spirit exists as we are “in Christ”
 - 3. Sin and death have no place where the Spirit reigns eternal.
- III. Substitution - (3)
 - E. What the law could not do
 - 1. It cannot condemn sin
 - 2. It cannot eliminate the problem
 - 3. The law can only reveal sin, it cannot destroy it.
 - F. The law’s weakness is in the flesh
 - 1. Hebrews 10:1
 - 2. Hebrews 10:4
 - G. The Law demanded what the flesh could not deliver – perfection
 - H. The flesh was condemned to be lost without hope of salvation
 - I. Through Jesus Christ sin was ultimately defeated - 2 Corinthians 5:21
 - J. God condemned the sin that condemned us
 - K. What the law could not do, God has done through Christ!
 - 1. In our flesh we had no ability to save ourselves
 - 2. So, it was in the flesh that Christ had to save us! - John 1:14
 - a. Hebrews 10:5
 - b. Hebrews 10:10
 - c. Hebrews 10:19-20
- IV. Sanctification - (4)
 - L. “the righteousness of the law” – it is our standard to live by.
 - M. “might be fulfilled in us” - filled with the righteousness of Christ.
 - N. “Who walk not after the flesh” – Our flesh can ever satisfy God’s law
 - O. Who walk “after the Spirit” – Romans 8:9-10
